Subject : Notice on hazards posed by magnetic toys, water beads and button batteries

Hazards posed by toys that do not meet safety standards

General consumer goods, such as toys and children's products, are required to meet applicable safety standards formulated or adopted and published by international standards bodies and organisations. Non-compliant toys should not be supplied or sold.

This notice highlights the potential safety hazards posed by three categories of toys that do not comply with toy safety standards: i) **magnetic ball toys**; ii) **water beads**; and iii) electric toys containing **button batteries that are improperly secured** (e.g. the button batteries are accessible without the aid of a tool or through a single action).


Educators are advised to keep a lookout and ensure that these three categories of toys are not made accessible to children at educational institutes. Educators are also encouraged to avoid using magnetic ball toys and water beads as sensory toys for children. Button batteries should also be kept out of reach of children, and electronic devices containing button batteries should be properly secured (e.g. accessible only with the aid of a tool) if they are made accessible to children.

Educators are also advised to warn children, parents or caregivers of the hazards posed by these three types of products.

Details on the safety hazards of these three items are as follows.

No.	Item	Hazard
1	Magnetic ball toys	 Magnetic ball toys are small but powerful, with a high magnetic flux. If two or more pieces are swallowed, they can cause serious harm or death by pinching or perforating the intestines and will require surgery for removal.
2	Water beads / jelly beads / gel beads / water orbs / hydro orbs / orbeez	 Water beads are very small and absorb liquid slowly to expand. Over time, they can expand to hundreds of times their initial size.
